

MEETINGS FOR DEBATE:

COUNTRIES IN CONFLICT, FUTURE PROSPECTS AND CHALLENGES

In the search for and construction of a territory with an identity, with the challenge of identifying perspectives and conflicts framed from the local to the global and vice versa. It is necessary to reinforce participation, mutual recognition and coexistence, through mixed spaces that encourage the migrant and host population to reflect and build knowledge and critical awareness of the implications of the territory of origin/host in the defence of human rights through the exchange of knowledge and experiences.

In this sense, it is difficult to consolidate a process of integration and management of diversity without strengthening solidarity, involvement and social mobility at a local level. To this end, a series of meetings have been prepared, which develop a participatory methodology through the analysis of the different structural conflicts in the South of the territory.

The meetings aim to understand the relational complexity and its connection to the processes of integration and reception from a bidirectional sense, taking into account different points of view; that of the immigrants and that of the autochthonous people.
